## MODERATOR'S MUSINGS

For Community United Church of Christ, the Building With Faith in The Future capital campaign is an opportunity not only to take our church building to new heights of beauty and stability, but also to enhance and solidify what we've been doing as a congregation for more than a century and a half. Over the past 150 years, the members of this church have committed thousands of hours and countless resources to oppose injustice and discrimination and to support equal rights for all. With the support of our members and friends, we can build on our tradition of progressive Christianity and social justice.

The power of this support can't be overstated. Let me give you one example: In 1855, the fledgling First Congregational Church, the first and oldest of the three churches that make up CUCC, was not only searching for a permanent place of worship, but doing so without a full time pastor. The Congregational Building Society raised and donated almost \$200 dollars toward the effort. That fund, together with the gifts of money, labor, and material made possible the completion of the \$1,000 building we have come to know as "The Goose Pond Church." It is not a stretch to say that the 150-year-old building fund is still at work today.

During the 1987 campaign, the building fund worked to make our church more welcoming to more people, adding a wheelchair accessible entrance, an elevator, and five classrooms for our Sunday School program. Today, we continue focusing on structural changes that will allow us to more effectively share our gifts and open our doors to more people.

The goal of this campaign is an ambitious endeavor, but so was starting a Congregational Church in 1853 with seven people with a desire for democracy, so was standing against slavery, so are Sunday school, choir, Youth Group mission trips, and weekly worship that provide us with words and music to inspire us.

Our mission remains the three pillars that have sustained us for 150 years:

- Ø Practicing Progressive Christianity
- Ø Seeking a Just Peace for All
- Ø Creating an Open and Affirming welcoming community

Our vision is a church with an even stronger individual and community impact. I invite you to join us in our efforts to take our church to new heights of excellence by offering support to the Building with Faith in the Future Capital Campaign.

## Building with Faith in the Future Community UCC Capital Campaign

**Campaign Update:** After four small group meetings between members of our congregation and Bob Devine of Devine Engineering, the "Building with Faith in the Future" Capital Campaign Pledge Drive began on Sunday, April 5<sup>th</sup>. As of April 26<sup>th</sup>, we have 22 pledges for \$210,940 towards our goal of 61 pledges and \$425,000. This is a tremendous start, but in the month of May we will all need to fully commit to this campaign if we are to reach our goal.

This campaign is ambitious by necessity. With the support of the congregation in the next year, it is proposed that we will not only renovate our decrepit Fellowship Hall kitchen into a safe modern space of which we can all be proud, but we will also replace our aging, inefficient steam boiler heating system into a modern forced air system that will be not only be cheaper to run, but more environmentally responsible.

The Buildings and Grounds Team has already begun the necessary preparatory work using funds that are already in our church budget, but to complete the work, each of us must do our part in whatever way we are able. The estimated total cost for this project is \$550,000. The closer our pledge commitments get to this amount the more work we will be able to do in the immediate future.

For the next few weeks during Sunday Worship, you will hear stories from fellow members about what this church has meant to them and why it is important for our future to participate in this campaign. We hope that you will join with them in prayerfully considering making a pledge commitment for this capital campaign.

### Reminder - Crop Walk Coming May 3<sup>rd</sup>

The 2009 Crop Walk will be a Memorial walk for Curt Wilson who was Treasurer and Registrar for CROP since it began in Champaign-Urbana in 1992. Since Curt was also an active member of CUCC, we hope to have a big group of walkers and a large amount of money raised from CUCC.

CROP Walk is the original walk for charity. It began after WW II when farmers in North Dakota actually gleaned their grain fields and sent the grain to hungry Europe. In a few years, raising money rather than gleaning was deemed more practical. CROP works through Church World Service (CWS) with the CROP emphasis on feeding hungry people. CWS is a Christian organization that works in most countries in the world. CWS works through local partners in each country and is very efficient in the use of money (Curt and I visited India some years ago and observed the way the money was spent - we were impressed). The Regional director of CWS/CROP in St. Louis is coming to join our walk as a tribute to Curt and others who have kept CROP going for at least 18 years, each year increasing the amount of money raised.

On Sunday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>, there will be a commissioning for the ten or more walkers, who include David Wilson, son of Jan and Curt Wilson, at CUCC. After, we will join others at 1:45 pm at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church located at 2101 South Prospect, Champaign. There will be a brief service at the church, distribution of maps of the walk route, instructions, and a dedication of the walkers. We leave the church around 2:15 pm for the 10K walk (6.25 miles). The route is always circular so if you cannot walk that far, you can cut across and return. A van circulates the route and is in contact with those at the church if any walker has a problem or needs a ride.

The sign up to walk, walk envelopes, and the opportunity to contribute to a walker began on Sunday, March 29<sup>th</sup>. We hope to have each walker raise at least \$100. Several have raise considerably more. CUCC raised \$1855 in 2008. Contributions can also be made at the CROP secure website: [www.cu-cropwalk.org](http://www.cu-cropwalk.org). 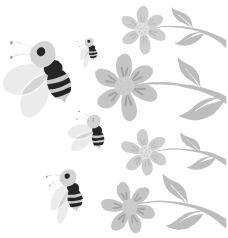

## An Update from the Buildings and Grounds Team

Thank you to all who were able to attend the “Building for the Future” capital campaign informational meetings. The groups provided invaluable input from the people who have lovingly cared for the building in the past and helped us visualize – together – our future.

Guiding us through the building rehabilitation and renovation process are: Bob Devine, Mechanical Engineer, Guy Hampel, Architect, and Karen Devine, Interior Designer. The three will work together throughout the design process; Bob will serve as the overall Project Coordinator. The team has extensive experience with older structures and they are committed to working with us to stabilize, restore, and improve our building.

As Bob outlined in his presentation, our first priority is to stabilize the building and keep water out. The work completed or in progress includes:

- Removal of the rotting, inefficient windows on the west side of Fellowship Hall;
- Re-routing of the downspouts on the west side of the building into a main municipal drain;
- Filling in the window wells on the west side of the building;
- Removal of the sidewalk on the west side of the building and replacement with concrete that slopes away from the building;
- Creation of a curb that serves as a dam to water in the parking lot;
- Extending the concrete around the southwest side of the building;
- A new bike rack on the southwest side of the building.

The second priority is to remove asbestos from designated areas of the building. Please note that when properly contained, as it is throughout CUCC, asbestos poses no danger to humans. Before we can proceed with specific maintenance or renovation work, however, the asbestos must be removed by qualified contractors. The work completed or in process includes:

- Opening the drywall in the soffits covering asbestos-wrapped pipes in the Fellowship Hall;
- Abatement of asbestos insulation wrapped around pipes in the basement of the building;
- Removal of asbestos-containing tile and glue in the basement kitchen and a small section of the Fellowship Hall (requiring removal of an area of carpet).

Projects to improve the appearance of the building include:

- Patching drywall in the Parlor and repainting walls and trim;
- Painting entry-ways and the upstairs hall;
- Patching and painting the center tower stairs.

There will be dust, there will be ladders, there will be partially-painted walls – but there will be progress! It is the intention of the Buildings and Grounds team to keep everyone as informed as possible about upcoming work – we thank you for your understanding, flexibility, and vision. Please note that all of this preliminary work is being paid for with money already on hand in various CUCC building funds.

Four routes ranging from 3 to 60 miles will give riders of all skill levels an opportunity to see the homes Champaign County has built with local low-income families.

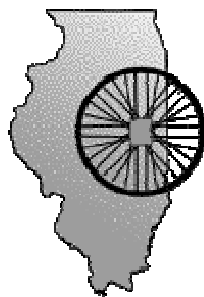

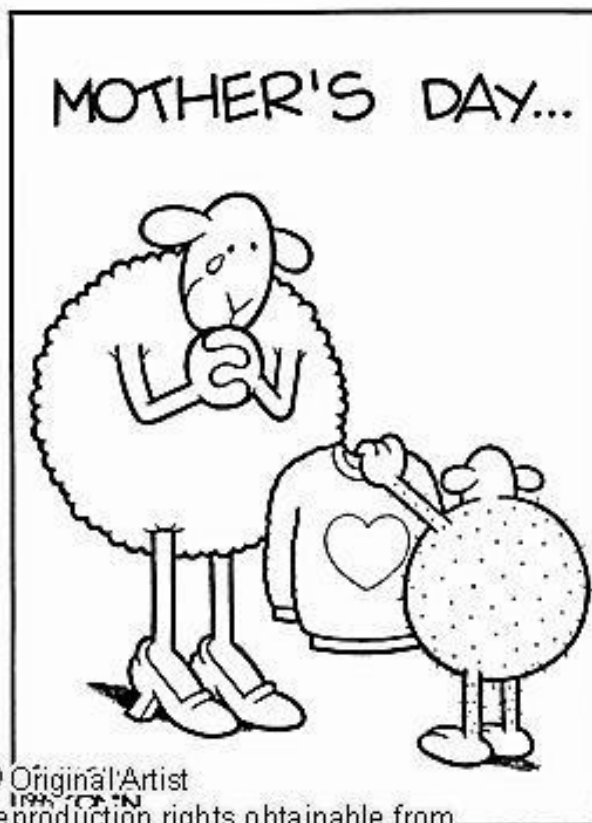
